At DOORWAYS our clients are first and foremost people; they are not numbers, they are people who very much matter. They are mothers and fathers, sisters and brothers, sons and daughters who need access to decent housing to survive and thrive.

Housing for... Health



Housing provides our clients access to better health; many have improved their CD4 counts and decreased their viral loads within 6 months of living in our homes. The client's individual need drives our services: 24-hour nursing care, treatment plans, transportation to medical appointments and healthy meals, rental assistance and

housing subsidies. We work to help people live at their highest level of independence despite any past crises that resulted from their illness.

Housing for... Hope



Hope is what we give our clients and their families; hope for a better today and a better tomorrow. Many of our clients were formerly deprived of hope living in poverty or on the streets. DOORWAYS has been able to place them in housing and rekindle their hope for better health and a better future.

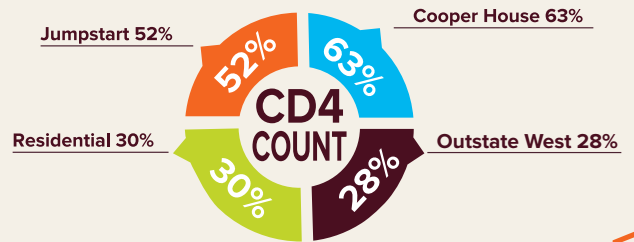

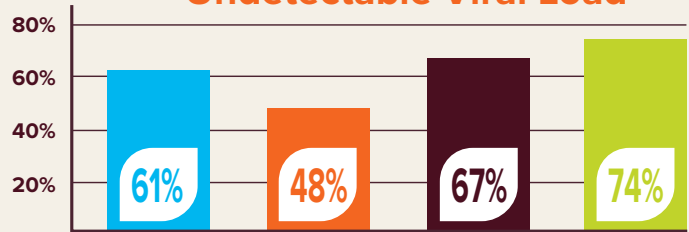
DOORWAYS served more than 2400 people; a 23% increase in direct clients from 2014.

CD4 COUNT

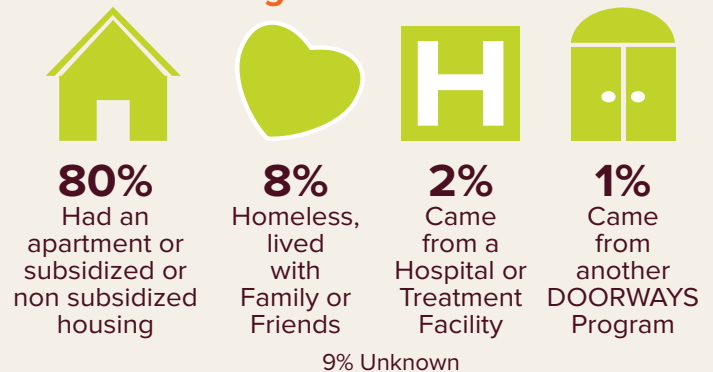


Undetectable Viral Load

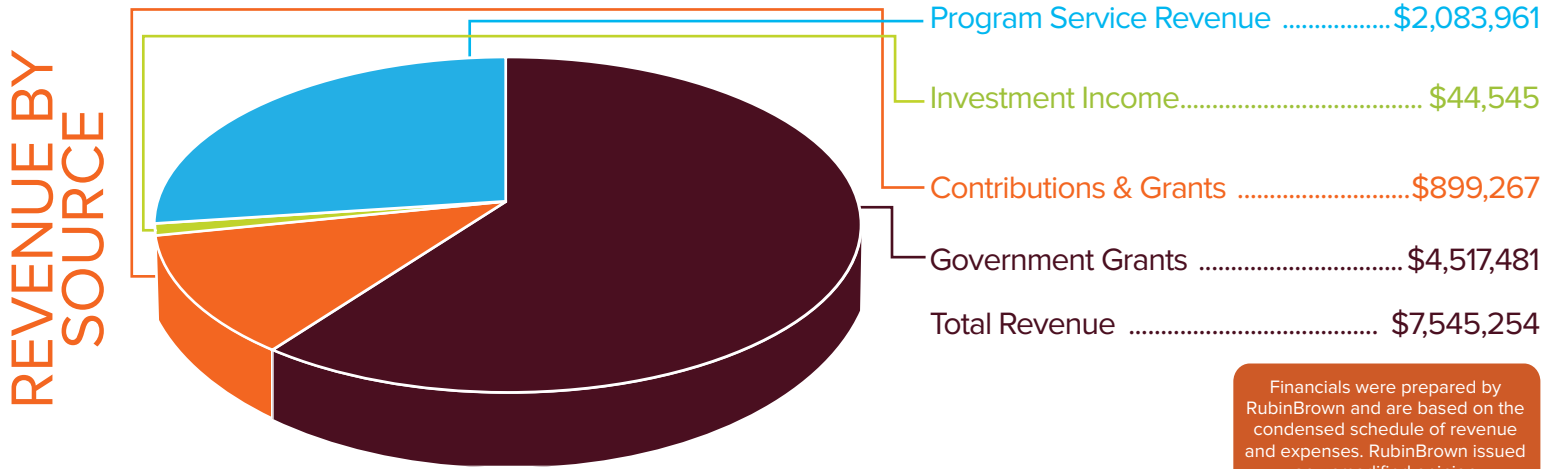

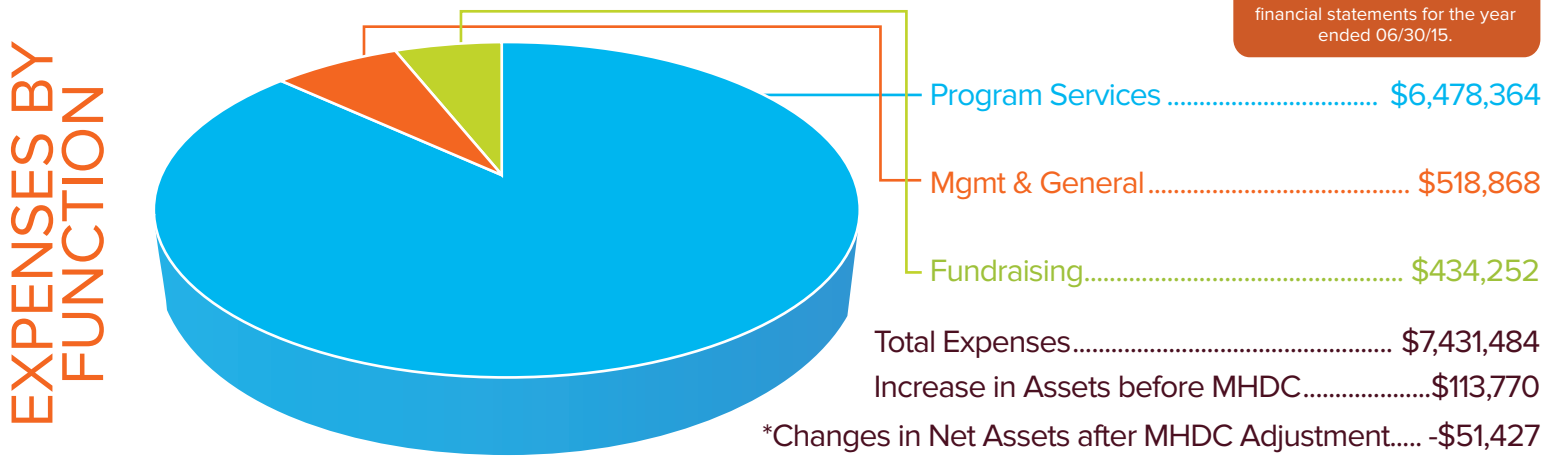
Financial Graphs - Revenues and Expenditures

DOORWAYS is now debt free! The excess in 2015 revenues allowed the organization to pay off a loan to Missouri Housing Development Corporation (MHDC).*
